Call for Workshop Proposals

AIED2009 workshops are designed to provide an opportunity for in-depth discussion of current and emerging topics of interest to the AIED community. We encourage workshop proposals that bring together people working on new and developing research topics that favor highly interactive discussions. Those proposing a workshop should provide information that the workshop is of interest to the AIED community, and why a workshop on this topic is beneficial. Workshop organizers and participants are also expected to attend the main AIED conference.

Proposal requirements and format (2-4 pages total length for proposal):

- Title
- Length of workshop: full or half-day
- Detailed description of the workshop topic's importance to AIED community
- Description of the workshop content and themes
- Names, short biographies, and contact information of workshop chair(s)
- List of organizing/program committee members. To ensure a workshop is of interest to the broader AIED community, members should be from multiple universities.
- Proposed format of the workshop (e.g., approximate timeline) and type of activities (e.g., paper presentations, discussions, demos, etc.)
- Please indicate any potential solicitation plans for workshop funding from sources, such as international projects, research networks, or industry.
(External funding is not required for acceptance.)

- Workshop paper submissions: April 16, 2009 (suggested deadline)

Workshop publications:

Approved workshops will have a locally printed proceedings independent from the main conference. They will also have a one-page summary in the main conference proceedings.

Short for main CFP:

Workshop proposals (2-4 pages) - Workshops on "hot" topics in AIED should include a brief description of the workshop topic, why it is interesting, short biographies of the workshop organizers, and a list of prospective members of the workshop program committee. Approved workshops will have their own locally printed proceedings and a one-page summary in the main conference proceedings. All workshops will be able to set their own submission/acceptance deadlines through April and May 2009.
